To Establish Regulations for Liquid Waste Disposal

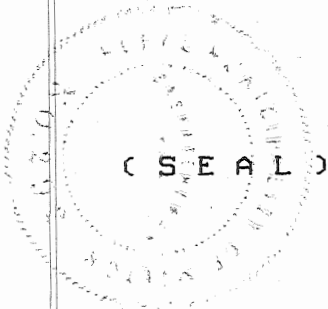
WHEREAS sewage effluent may be unsafe to the environment; and

WHEREAS sewage effluent may contaminate natural waterways ground water sources if disposed indiscriminately; and

WHEREAS a sewage sump may be hazardous to the public and animals, if not enclosed in an adequate fence;

THEREFORE, the council of the Rural Municipality of Milton No. 292, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. The council requires liquid sewage effluent to be contained on private property in a self-contained enclosure.
2. An owner of commercial property who disposes of liquid sewage effluent in an open hole sump shall fence the hole and erect a sign with letters no smaller than one inch in size, identifying the hole as a sewage sump.
3. Any spreading of liquid domestic waste by pumping shall be permitted on Agricultural Land only, with permission of the land owner;
4. An owner of commercial property may obtain special permission from the municipal council to pump liquid domestic waste, in an area designated by the council.
